IMPORTANT ITEMS FROM THE HELM

• LITHIUM BATTERIES:

As new advances are coming out in the marine industry, we have some new important procedures at CBM regarding lithium batteries. These batteries, although great technology have a significant fire risk, called thermal runaway and proper, quick reaction to potential fires are very important to prevent a catastrophic incident. If you have recently installed lithium batteries on your boat or are considering installing these, the marina is putting a new policy in place that you remove your batteries from your boat, take them home for storage for the winter and plan to use a fire-retardant containment, and suppression on your boat for these batteries. We are being proactive to keep the marina and our customers safe as these requirements will be coming in the very near future by insurance companies. Here is a quick article to help explain the risk and mitigation and as we learn more, we will keep our policies updated and keep you informed! LADDER STORAGE

Please don't lock your ladder to your cradle in the spring as this makes things difficult for the crew when they move cradles into storage or when taking them out for haul out. There is a ladder rack in the east yard to store your ladder, please lock it and mark your name on it. To prevent unwanted visitors when your boat is on the hard, don't leave your ladder up, rather fold it, place it on the ground and lock it up removing it after launch.

LIFE RINGS

New this spring, in the event of a man overboard at the marina, we will now be providing life rings at the end of every dock for all marina patrons to use in an emergency. All our staff, crew and management are all trained in First Aid/CPR/AED. We also train everyone on our staff, marina specific health and safety training. There are 3 AED machines generously provided by Collins Bay Yacht Club for all to use, one at the washrooms, one on S.S. Marina floating clubhouse on D dock and one by the launch ramp by E dock. We will offer marina specific health and safety training on Safety Day as well.

MARINE RADIO LICENSE COURSE

The marina monitors VHF, 68 for our boaters! If you are looking for assistance at the fuel dock, on or off your slip, radio us and our friendly staff will meet you!

AHOY! For the benefit of the Kingston area recreational and commercial boating community please be advised that a marine radio VHF operator's permit (Restricted Operator's Certificate Maritime - ROCM) classroom course is going to be conducted at Kingston Yacht Club by Can Boat / Nauti Savoir (Canadian Power and Sail Squadron) commencing in 2025 on Feb 05 and Mar 26 Pre-registration is highly recommended. There is an option for either an afternoon (2:30-4:30pm) or an evening (6:30-8:30pm) course. An ROCM is required in order to legally operate a marine VHF radio in Canada. For some employees this course is a legal requirement for the performance of their work. Registration for this classroom course, or a different, equivalent self-study or virtual course, can be accessed through the Can Boat / Nauti Savoir website at EDUCATION then select

<u>Maritime Radio Certificate - ROC(M)</u>, then select <u>Classroom</u> and look for <u>Kingston</u>. *Jurek Romaniec*, M: 343.477.0241
